


Figure 3: Bixia Yuanjun.




Figure 3: Hexagram 11 Tai.




Figure 1. Paul Cezanne, The Bay of Marseilles seen from L'Estaque.




Figure 2: Paul Cézanne, Aix-en-Provence, França [France],1839–1906. Rochedos em L'Estaque [Cliffs in L'Estaque],1882–85. Óleo sobre tela [Oil on canvas], 73 × 92 cm. Acervo [Collection] Museu de Arte de São Paulo Assis Chateaubriand. Doação [Gift] Edward Marvin,1953 MASP.00087. Foto [Photo] João Musa.




Figure 1: Underwater scene from Masuda and Nisbett's experiment




Figure 2: Étienne Dupérac (1525–1604), bird's-eye plan view of the gardens at Villa d'Este (Tivoli) Italy between 1560 and 1575.




Figure 1: Taiwan independence versus unification with the mainland.
